

### Welcome to the Graduate School Application Planner

I used to be an admissions counselor and in all my years of counseling students I know first hand it can be overwhelming and hard to stay organized during the application process especially when applying to graduate school and potentially juggling a full time job. I created this planner based on questions *I KNOW* you should ask and on all the elements of the application process that you need to keep track of.

If you are applying to a few schools, print out or duplicate each sheet to keep track of the information you gather and remember don't assume anything and always ask because the process is different everywhere!

### Some things to remember during the application process:

- 1) BREATHE!
- 2) Get organized with application types and dates
- 3) Identify the type of program you are looking for
- 4) Have a discussion with your partner/family before you start looking at schools to understand what your financial plan is
- 5) Do NOT commit to a school without visiting first, you will get a feeling if it is the right fit when you step on campus and talk to students
- 6) Think about the outcome you are trying to get to by going to graduate school, will the school you are looking at get you there?
- 7) Be very intentional when asking about internships and co-ops and the resources the school can provide AFTER you complete the program

What is the most important thing in your selection process?



### **Graduate School Financial Planning**

When it comes to finances make sure you have a conversation with yourself/parent/family about what makes sense for paying for the program. There are many different ways to finance graduate school including tuition reimbursement from your employer, fellowships, graduate assistance programs, federal aid, merit based aid and external scholarships. Most schools have some scholarship offerings but don't forget about private scholarships. Do your research and see if you can find additional scholarships to apply for - most require an essay or a submission to be considered.

Also don't forget about application fees. Most schools charge a fee to apply using their application - there are some application fee waivers but it is still a cost to consider.

Use this planner as you do your research to stay organized and ask the right questions!

### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS: ABOUT PAYING FOR COLLEGE

These questions are in no way inclusive of everything you need to think about and should be discussed with a financial planner, but they are a starting place.\*

### **TO DISCUSS**

What range of tuition am I able to afford?

Which schools fall into that range?

Will I be eligible for financial aid? If so, how much?

Does my employer offer a tuition reimbursement program? If so what is the committment?

How much debt will I take on after the program?

Does the career I am aiming for help to pay for student debt? (The answer to this might be no, but it is important to think about how much debt you will be able to take on and be realistic about the future)

Are there any other scholarships or financial aid you suggest to apply for?

What does the scholarship money apply to (ie tuition, books, fees)?

Are there departmental scholarships and are they located on a separate website?

Do you have a graduate assistant program?

Do you offer fellowships?

Who is the best contact for additional questions?

Did you apply to any scholarships outside of the ones the school offers?

How do you supplement your tuition?

Do you find it hard to balance school and a full time job?

What resources are availble for you to find a job after the program is complete?

### **QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF**

### WHERE TO APPLY

What program am I interested in? Does the school have it?

What is financially feasible for tuition?

Does the school have the resources I am looking for?

What type of campus do I like being on?

What type of learning environment am I looking for? (In-person, remote, hybrid)

Is the campus close to a city? Do I want to be close to a city?

Do I see myself going to school here?

Do my academics match what the school is looking for?

Does it meet what I am looking for? (ie diversity, culture, opportunities)

Does the learning environment match what works for me? (ie class sizes, professors)

### WHERE TO ATTEND

Does the school work financially?

Do the professors seem knowledge?

Does the school have career services to help me find a job?

Did the students speak highly of the school?

Are there internship and co-op opportunities?

Do they have notable alumni?

Do they have a network of professionals to connect to?

### WHAT AM I LOOKING FOR IN A COLLEGE?

It's okay if you don't know the answers to some of these questions. These are meant to help you think about what you might be looking for in a school, and as you go on tours you can ask questions and talk to students to get a better idea.
