An academic minor is a secondary area of specialization or concentration that you can pursue alongside your major during your university studies. It typically requires fewer courses than a major and allows you to explore another field of interest in addition to your primary area of study. Minors can complement your major, providing additional skills and knowledge that may enhance your career prospects or personal interests.

Equity & Justice Studies

The Menlo College EJS minor includes courses in economics, history, humanities, political science, psychology, and social sciences. It is designed for students with an interest in social justice who seek a deeper understanding of the role of systemic inequities, social movements, revolutions, and uprisings in the United States and globally. The study of disenfranchised groups will allow students to view their studies through a lens that critically explores the role of privilege, oppression, and dominant ideology no matter the personal, academic, or professional path they choose.

Political Science

The Political Science minor is designed for students with an interest in political institutions, the processes by which political decisions are made and the values, interests, and other influences that inform those decisions. It is designed for students with an interest in politics and government who seek a deeper understanding of how an individual can participate meaningfully in politics, and a deeper understanding of contemporary political issues, including national, state, and local problems, and their historical contexts.
